



Customizing the iPad to Support a Clinical Fellowship in Radiology: a Qualitative Study


Objectives

To determine the value of providing Fellows in the Breast Imaging Service (Department of Radiology) with iPad mini tablets pre-loaded with productivity apps, pertinent eBooks, diagnostic tools, health information resource pathways, and current awareness resources; and to test whether a tablet is a viable delivery platform.


Methods

Pre- and post-clinical surveys were administered using SurveyMonkey. The pre-survey was done during Fellows orientation where they were given the iPad and introduced to the selected resources. Upon completion of their clinical rotation the final survey was administered. Results were analyzed by both the Informationist and the Associate Attending.

The resources provided on the iPad meet my productivity and workflow needs.

Results

Comparing the pre- and post-rotation survey results determined future perspectives on continuing an iPad program under the responsibility of the Informationist, as well as, assisted in prioritizing the selected resources and identifying future training opportunities.

Conclusions

The customization of the iPad was well received among Fellows in this pilot study but had certain limitations. Data gathered suggest that the iPad was a time-saver and provided in-context and in-the-moment resources. Where it fell short was its inability to handle file transfer/storage of documents. A noticeable upswing in research consultation and informal training requests were also observed.
